Mr. Panebianco joined the Arlington Cooperation Foundation (ACF) in 2005 in an effort to merge the Marathon Charity Partners with this charitable foundation. Through the ACF, the Marathon Charity Partners expanded their programs, provided a source of operating income for the charities and provided a base of beneficiaries for the ACF philanthropic efforts. Mr. Panebianco served on the Board of Directors was elected President in 2009 when he merged MCP into the ACF and changed the name to Marathon Charity Cooperation. Since 2009, MCC/MCP has provided over \$550,000 in grants to MCC/MCP charity partners.

Founder and Coordinator

Mr. Panebianco founded the Marathon Charity Partners (MCP) in 2004 to augment the Run for Kids program and expand philanthropic efforts within the local running community. MCP was a coalition of charities that combine efforts to train runners for several marathon and half-marathon opportunities each year. Mr. Panebianco served as the coordinator of this partnership which required management and planning of all partnership activities conducted year around. MCP supported several dozen charities that conducted programs to serve children and those less fortunate on four continents. From 2004-2008, MCP raised over \$75,000 for both local and global charitable causes.
